# Our Value for this month is Hope

#### Maths

This term we will continue with our multiplication and division topic looking at multiplying a larger 2 digit number by a 1 digit number. The strategies that we will be using are a tens and ones jotting which will then lead onto the formal column method. We will also be looking at division with a larger 2 digit number by using a jotting as a strategy.

Please remember to keep reciting and asking questions in and out of order on the 2,3,4,5, 8 and 10 times tables. Don't forget to use the times tables to find the related division facts and to be able to write out the fact family statements. e.g.

 $3 \times 4 = 12$   $12 \div 3 = 4$  $4 \times 3 = 12$   $12 \div 4 = 3$ 

#### **English**

This term the class reader book is <u>The Diary</u> of a Killer Cat by Anne Fine. Could you please read this with your child and return to school the week beginning 6<sup>th</sup> February.

Please listen to your child read their home reading book at least 3 times a week. The children can change their own reading book as often as they would like.

In our English lessons we will be writing mystery and adventure stories, as well as chronological reports.

Spellings - the children will bring home their spelling book every Thursday to show you their test score and so that you can see which spellings still need to be practised. We will also be doing the statutory spelling challenge at the end of each term.
