Welcome

Dates and Things to Remember

Everdon School Trip – 3rd October 2022 (more details to follow). Children should bring in a water bottle that will be returned home every day. Our PE lessons will be on Thursdays and initially this year, we will be doing Swimming instead of a second PE slot. Please ensure that your child has the appropriate kit for indoor and outdoor PE and that kits are brought in Mondays and taken home again on Fridays.

Swimming sessions will begin from Friday 9th September and will continue until Christmas. We expect that children come with their swimming costumes under their uniform on Friday mornings. Please ensure that they have a swimming hat, a towel and a change of clean underwear.

Topic

Our topic for this term until Christmas is Ancient Greece. We will have an Ancient Greece Wow Day on Thursday 22nd September where the children can come dressed as a person during Ancient Greek Times if they would like to. We will be doing a lot of art activities that day as well as learning all about the ancient society! Through a thematic approach, the children will make links between many of their subjects over the term, incorporating work through Literacy, History and Art.

Maths

During our first few weeks in school, we will be refreshing the children's learning from Year 3 and focussing on any gaps in their knowledge. Following that, we will begin to look at place value as well as extending our understanding and use of formal written methods for addition and subtraction. We will continue to focus on rapid recall of multiplication tables which is extremely important and supports children with a solid foundation and fluency in Maths. The government has introduced a Key Stage 2 Multiplication Tables Check (MTC) that all Year 4 pupils will take in Summer Term 2021. The purpose of this government-led test is to determine whether Year 4 pupils can fluently recall multiplication tables up to 12 × 12 in accordance with the National Curriculum objectives. We would appreciate it if you could support your child with learning their multiplication tables at home on a regular basis in order to help their pace of recall and accuracy. Practising online using a touchscreen or keypad in the same format as the test will be invaluable. A good website to help your children work against the clock is

English

This term, the children will be writing persuasive letters, stories with alternative endings and beginning to look at playscripts ready for our upcoming Christmas play! It remains extremely important that your child is reading regularly at home. Please ensure that your child has the opportunity to read a range of texts, both independently as well as with an adult, to encourage confidence, progression and, most importantly, a love of reading. As part of their homework, children need to read at least twice a week with an adult at home. Stage books, assigned at their own individual reading level, should be brought home from school to read. Please initial the children's reading records each week. These will be collected in each Tuesday.

Homework

Homework will be set each Thursday and should be handed in the following Tuesday. Homework will include weekly spellings to practise. It should be marked with an adult at home. The weekly spelling test will take place each Tuesday morning. Times tables will be tested on Wednesdays. Our class book this term is The Butterfly Lion by Michael Morpurgo.
