#### **Maths**

This term, the children will be focussing heavily on the unit of fractions. We will be looking at areas such as: equivalent fractions, adding and subtracting fractions, fractions of amounts and fraction problem solving questions. We will also start to look at the links between fractions and decimals. We will also link our homework closely to what we are learning in school.

The Multiplication Tables Check (MTC) test is looming closer and will be carried out in June this year. We would appreciate it if you could support your child with learning their multiplication tables at home on a regular basis in order to help their pace of recall and accuracy. ## **English**

In English this term we will be writing a nonchronological report about the Stone Age including information about tools, clothes, homes and food. We will be linking this heavily with our Topic work. The children will be focussing on writing complex sentences using fronted adverbials, embedded clauses and expanded noun phrases to develop their creative writing this term.

Please ensure that your child is reading at home at least twice per week. If your child chooses to read independently, please still ensure that this is signed. Regular spelling practice will also ensure that children score well on their weekly tests each Tuesday. Please recap previous spellings from time to time to help your child retain them in their long-term memory.

The children's previous class reader, Stig of the Dump by Clive King, is to be returned on the first week back (20<sup>th</sup> – 24<sup>th</sup> February).
