The Importance of Times Tables

The National Curriculum expects that children should achieve the following:

Year 2 – 2's, 3's, 5's and 10's

Year 3 - 4's and 8's as well as Y2 tables

Year 4 – all tables up to 12 times 12.

Year 5 and 6 – related division facts and multiples of tables eg 6x70=420 and $42\div7=6$.

At the end of Year 4 all children will have a computerised test which expects the children to answer each question within 6 seconds. For children who have already experienced this, it is quite tough but the timings are really important as a quick recall of times tables facts is a very important life skill that impacts on much of a child's maths learning in Upper Key Stage 2. Please can you help your child to practise times tables regularly so that speed and confidence can be developed. We will also do the same at school but school practise alone is often not enough.

I would recommend little and often. Some useful processes include singing and chanting; counting; look and cover and say and write and check; using of Maths Frame. https://mathsframe.co.uk/en/resources/resource/477/M ultiplication-Tables-Check
