I hope everyone has had a restful holiday for the past two weeks. I know it probably wasn't as most had planned but the weather has been extremely kind and has enabled us to get out for walks and time in the garden.

Next week is the start of the summer term and children will be expected to continue their learning from Monday onwards. Please ensure that your child reads/shares a book daily as well as completes at least two hours of home learning per day. I have asked teachers to set another 2 weeks of learning for their class. This will consist of 5 Maths, 5 English lessons, 2 Science lessons and 8 other. Mrs Britton has also set some French learning for Key Stage 2 children and in our last newsletter we shared a whole school art project. Teachers will email out this work to each class on the morning of Monday 20th April and should parents struggle to print out copies, it is possible to collect a paper pack during your daily exercise within the village. Please email Nicola Elliott or Mr Rosevear should you need this. Teachers will continue to use Purple Mash and children can complete work using this system. In particular it is important for children in Year 2 onwards to practise their times tables which can be done using the times tables functions in Purple Mash.

One aspect of Purple Mash which the children have particularly enjoyed, is the way that the system allows teachers to communicate with them – giving praise and rewards. Over the next two weeks, we would like children to share at least one completed piece of work per day with their teacher. This can be done via Purple Mash if the work is linked to this system. Alternatively, parents can photo artwork, writing or send files to teachers via the teacher's email address. Teachers, in return, will try to respond with some feedback. Please note that this may take a bit of time as teachers will also be in school providing childcare to key workers at various points throughout the week.
