Spelling Bee - Key Stage 1 and 2

Last term we evaluated our spelling procedures in school and following consultation with the staff, children and parents we have decided to reshape the way children learn spellings. Therefore, we will no longer be sending home a termly spelling bee instead the children will have weekly spellings still following the National Curriculum year group expectations. Your child will be given a list of words each week which will be tested the following week. It is expected that these words will be spelt correctly in both the test and within general written work. The Look, Read, Cover, Write and Check system is the most effective method for learning and retaining spellings.
