#### Maths

This term we will continue with our multiplication and division topic looking at multiplying a larger 2 digit number by a 1 digit number. The strategies that we will be using are a tens and ones jotting which will then lead onto the formal column method. We will also be looking at division with a larger 2 digit number by using a jotting as a strategy.

Please remember to keep reciting and asking questions in and out of order on the 2,3,4,5, 8 and 10 times tables.

One area that you could help with your child's maths learning is by doing some work on time before we meet the topic in the summer. Specifically, to the nearest 5 minutes on an analogue clock face.

#### **English**

This term the class reader book is <u>The Diary</u> of a Killer Cat by Anne Fine. Could you please read this with your child and return to school the week beginning 12<sup>th</sup> February.

In our English lessons we will continue to work on writing in paragraphs for our non-chronological report about Floods. The children will also be writing a set of instructions for something they have experienced, as well as looking at different forms of poetry.

Spellings - the children will bring home their spelling book every Thursday to show you their test score and so that you can see which spellings still need to be practised. Please recap the statutory spellings from time to time ready for our spelling challenge.
