Key People and Events

<b>Christopher Columbus</b>	Columbus was an Italian explorer who was born in Genoa in 1451 and died in 1506. He was credited with discovering the 'New World' (Americas). Columbus sailed in the Santa Maria with the Pinta and Nina ships part of the fleet. He brought back many new things such as gold, silver and potatoes. He enslaved the natives of the lands he discovered.
<b>Neil Armstrong</b>	An American astronaut, naval aviator and test pilot. Armstrong was born 5 <sup>th</sup> August 1930 and died 25 <sup>th</sup> August 2012. He was the first person to walk on the moon.
<b>One small step</b>	The first words spoken on the moon were, "One small step for man, one giant leap for mankind."
<b>Apollo 11</b>	The rocket which took Neil Armstrong, Buzz Aldrin and Michael Collins to the moon.
<b>The Santa Maria</b>	The ship used by Columbus to voyage to the 'New World'.
<b>The new world</b>	Caribbean Islands, Gulf of Mexico, South and Central America.
<b>16<sup>th</sup> July 1969</b>	The date when the crew of Saturn 5 launched from The Kennedy Space Centre in Florida, USA on its mission to land on the moon.
<b>3<sup>rd</sup> August 1492</b>	The date when Columbus set sail from Spain on his voyage to discover new lands.

Vital Vocabulary!

<b>exploration</b>	The act of exploring or finding an unfamiliar area.
<b>courageous</b>	Not put off by danger, being brave.
<b>fleet</b>	A group of ships which sail together.
<b>Apollo 11</b>	The command module that was carried by the rocket Saturn 5, and landed on the moon.
<b>colonizer</b>	Someone who sends people to a place who then settle there and take over control of the place.
<b>slavery</b>	Being forced to work for someone against their will without payment.
<b>Saturn 5</b>	The rocket which carried the crew and command module Apollo 11 to the moon.

Historical Skills and Enquiry

- Consider how significant people from the past have had an impact on our lives today, making connections to the past and present.
- Show where significant people and events studied fit in chronological order and begin to sequence them.
- Begin to gain historical perspective by recounting interesting facts from an historical perspective.
- Consider why events happened and their consequences.

- Recognise and make connections about why people did things, why events happened and what happened as a result.
- Compare pictures or photographs of people or events in the past.
- Sequence artefacts that are close together in time.
