Dates and Things to Remember

Topic

This term we will be starting a new topic based on Natural Disasters and, using a thematic approach, will make links across English, geography and art. To start our topic we will be having a Wow Day on 13th January. The day will be creative and hands on, so children are asked to wear scruffy home clothes that may get dirty. We will continue to run our Show and Tell sessions on Friday afternoons with topic related items. Thank you to all of those children who have shared their items already, they have been fascinating.

Maths

In maths this term we will be continuing our focusing on multiplication and division. In addition, we will start work on area as well as fractions.

We will continue to focus on rapid recall of multiplication tables which is extremely important and supports children with a solid foundation and fluency in maths. This year, the government has introduced a Key Stage 2 Multiplication Tables Check (MTC) that all Year 4 pupils will take in Summer Term 2020. In school, the children will continue with their rapid recall practise along with their weekly Tuesday test. Thank you for supporting your child to learn their tables at home, doing this on a regular basis really helps their pace of recall and accuracy. Now that the children are becoming more fluent in their tables, practising online using a touch screen in the same format as the test will be invaluable.
